Provide training to caregivers on the child's specific needs and how to best support them.

Access to Resources

Identify and secure access to government assistance programs, special needs trusts, and other resources to support the child.

Collaborating with Schools and Healthcare Providers

IEPs and 504s

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Work closely with school officials to ensure the child receives appropriate educational support and accommodations.

Communication

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Maintain open lines of communication with healthcare providers to ensure the child's medical needs are met.


Shared Information
